Gift of Life Donor Program, the nonprofit organization serving the Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Delaware, is responsible for recovering and distributing organs and tissues used in life-saving and life-enhancing transplants. Gift of Life coordinates life-enhancing the life of people and their living conditions.

In the gift of life assessment I wrote a poem talking the liver donors and organs people gave away to save people's lives. I wrote a poem to inform people of organ donation and to show the importance of helping others. What i learned from the GOL project is that life-saving organs for transplant include the heart, kidney, pancreas, lungs, liver and intestines. Tissues, such as bones, ligaments and tendons, are needed for important surgical procedures to repair injured or diseased joints and bones. Corneas, heart valves and skin may also be donated.

An example I choose from our course of anatomy is dissection the pig we experienced what a human might go through while enduring a transplant. Even though we did not do a complete transplant we took out organs. My poem talked about the importance of life. Showing the organ transplant showed how you could give someone a new life with a simple easy task. The implication of learning about the human anatomy by the organ donation is Living individuals can donate one of the two kidneys and the remaining kidney provides the necessary function needed to remove waste from the body. Single kidney donation is the most frequent living donor procedure.

In conclusion the whole purpose of my project was to make sure people can get informed of organ donation. It was set to help the gift of life as they do the same in promoting this.
